

WINTERIZING YOUR PRESSURE WASHER

When you are ready to store your pressure washer for the winter season. You can follow the steps below to prevent any costly repairs. Damage caused by freezing is not covered by the manufacturers warranty.

1. Follow normal shut down and pressure relief procedures as shown in your owners manual. Make sure that water supply is shut off and disconnected from the pump.
2. You will need to obtain a 1 gallon container of **Non Toxic (RV)** type antifreeze.
3. Next install a suction hose from the pump inlet (garden hose fitting) into container of **Non Toxic** antifreeze as shown in Fig 1.
4. Install pressure wash hose and gun to pump.
5. Start engine and squeeze trigger on gun to draw antifreeze into pump, hose, and gun.
6. Once antifreeze comes out of gun, shut engine off.
7. Squeeze trigger to relieve any pressure in system.
8. Remove pressure wash hose and gun and safely store pressure washer.
9. For engine winterizing please refer to your engine owners manual for proper storage.
10. When you are ready to use the pressure washer again, simply install garden hose to pump inlet, pressure wash hose and gun and turn water on.
11. Hold trigger open until water comes out clear.
12. Now you are ready to proceed with pressure washing.
